

MacPhail Center for Music is the nation's largest community music school with 6 locations serving 15,000 students. We deliver programming for students ages 6 weeks to 104 years old, through program areas of <u>Sing Play Learn with MacPhail®</u>, <u>Suzuki Talent Education</u>, <u>School Partnerships</u>, <u>Individual Instruction</u>, <u>Group Instruction</u>, <u>Summer Music Programs</u>, <u>MacPhail Music for Life™</u>, and <u>Music Therapy</u>.

In early 2014 members of the Hormel Foundation Board of Directors initiated conversations with MacPhail Center for Music senior leadership regarding a presence for MacPhail in the community of Austin. The conversations quickly moved into action as the community reception to the possibility was incredibly positive. A cornerstone partnership throughout has been the relationship with the Austin Public Schools. As student enrollment grew to 1500 students for MacPhail Austin, a plan was developed in 2016 for new space to be developed and renovated to support both the Austin High School music programs and space for MacPhail Austin. The result is a state-of-the-art facility shared by both. It is a one-of-a-kind facility, unique in the country, housing both a community music school and a public high school music program. MacPhail Austin Programming

I. <u>6 weeks through Kindergarten</u>

Sing Play Learn with MacPhail® is MacPhail's award-winning early childhood music education program. The Sing Play Learn curriculum is designed for a child's specific stage of development and encourages children to explore musical concepts and to experiment with new instruments.

II. Grades 1 through 4

In-School Residency - Korean Folk Songs study with Dr. Soojin Lee.

- Dr. Lee has 20 years of teaching experience from individual instruction to large group teaching, including serving as a high school general music teacher in Korea, a private instructor of gayageum (a traditional Korean stringed instrument) and piano, and a school residency of Korean music and drumming in U.S. schools.
- Dr. Lee rehearsed the prepared songs in 54 elementary classrooms in Austin. In advance of
 the visit, Dr. Lee presented teachers at Bandfield, Sumner, and Southgate and Banfield a
 curriculum for them to teach the lessons and replicate in the future. Soojin also taught
 students to greet each other in Korean, performed on Gayageum then returned to
 accompany their recorded spring concerts.

Community Children's Choir

• Formed in 2015, this choir is open to all 3rd and 4th graders in the Austin Area. The goal is to join young voices together to begin techniques that support goals of older choir groups. Students from all elementary schools form new social experiences, then come together at

IJ Holton Intermediate school. The MacPhail Austin Children's Choir has been successful in breaking down the barriers of language, financial need, and transportation to form a choir that represents the face of Austin. Performances include collaboration with Austin Symphony Orchestra, Northwestern Singers, MacPhail Music Matters Luncheon and more.

Serving: 90-140 students per season

Pacelli Catholic School

- In 2015 MacPhail Center for Music and Pacelli Catholic schools developed a band and orchestra program that would serve Pacelli students in grades 4-8th. Pacelli students are equipped with techniques that will allow them to continue performing in high school where they can participate in Austin High School programming. Prior to the in-house program at Pacelli, there were 3 students participating in music. We currently serve 40 students per year selecting music carefully for the small ensemble at times our director composes for the unique instrumentation.

III. Grades 5 through 12

MacPhail Center Orchestra/Choir/Band

We work with APS music directors when they identify a need with which we can assist. Here are the ways that we assisted in 2021-2022:

- Beginner band and Orchestra assistance, helping t with beginning band techniques to keep class moving at the same level.
- Beginning Orchestra-work with students teaching bow hold and string techniques.
- Prepare students for solo and ensemble and other contest settings.
- Work with students auditioning for all state and other honor band programs
- Serving: 174 students

Rock Band Project

APS students interested in performing rock music were identified and placed in a band, Orange Haze. These students worked together to create an hour performance of popular music. Orange Haze members began to write originals and created a new ensemble: Torch.

IV. MacPhail Music for Life™

An interactive music education and creative arts program that brings the many benefits of music into the lives of students ages 55 and older regardless of experience level, ability, and musical goals. Classes include a variety of musical activities: singing, playing instruments, movement, relaxation, music history, and much more.

- **Unwrapping the Orchestra:** Austin Symphony Orchestra Principal Violist and Austin Middle School Orchestra Director Jacob Crosby will presents a sneak peek at the music being presented at ASO's concert to help listeners have a greater understanding for what they're hearing. V. <u>Music Therapy</u>

- Board-certified music therapists address a client's physical, emotional, cognitive, and/or social needs. After assessing the strengths and needs of each client, a music therapist provides treatment that may include creating, singing, playing an instrument, and moving and/or listening to music.
- Wu Yue, MacPhail Music Therapist, conducted research studies through the University of Minnesota for clients with an autism spectrum disorder diagnosis. Wu provided tele music therapy services to clients during the pandemic, 5 of which are from Austin and remained as clients with her post pandemic.
- MacPhail Austin is working towards developing our Music Therapy studio and partnerships throughout the community.

VI. Individual Lessons

- MacPhail's outstanding faculty are experienced in teaching beginning through advanced music lessons for children, youth, and adult learners. Students are paired with teachers who will best suit the students' needs, learning styles and to support growth.
